OUR HISTORY

Tuition and Capital Fund (2017-18)

There are 3 tuition payment options: (1) Pre-Pay (2) Semester Basis (3) Monthly. Monthly payments are **automatically** deducted from either your checking or savings account, we use a firm called F.A.C.T.S. When you set up your F.A.C.T.S. account during registration you will have the choice of a 9, 10, 11, or 12 months payment plan. The Capital Fund payment may be made in the same way as the tuition payments. **Tuition, Capital Fund, and Other Fees for the 2018-19 school year will be announced in late April or early May 2018.**

Pre-K Program B: \$10,300: 7 hours (4 hrs. curriculum plus 3 hrs. ext. care**, 8:05 AM - 3:05 PM).

Pre-K Program C: \$11,600: 10 hours (4 hrs. curriculum plus 6 hrs. ext. care**, 8:05 AM - 6:00 PM).

Pre-Kindergarten program is a separate program therefore no multi-child reduction in tuition.

FINANCIAL AID

The **BASIC Fund** provides scholarships to thousands of students each year. Their scholarships are awarded first-come first-served on the basis of financial need. The awards are based on household size and income, covering anywhere from 25-50% of a school's tuition, up to \$2,000 per student per year. Scholarships are awarded on a first come, first served basis beginning in January until early March. Applications received after the March deadline will be placed on a wait-list, and will be awarded periodically through the summer as funds become available. We do try to offer financial help to those families who sincerely want a Catholic Education for their child, but find that financially it is a hardship. Because funds are very limited at this time only currently enrolled families are eligible to apply for financial assistance from the school. Financial Aid is usually in the range of \$150-\$300 per year and is based on need. If at any time during the school year there are financial difficulties or an emergency, please notify the Principal, Mr. Brazil. Arrangements can be made before your account becomes delinquent.

Application Process and Admission Criteria

APPLICATION PROCESS

1. **Complete the online application on our school website for the desired school year, www.sibs.org.**
2. **Submit the following items to the school office on the day of your child's interview/testing appointment:**
 - \$70.00 application fee
 - Birth Certificate
 - Baptismal Certificate (Catholic students, only)
 - First Communion Certificate (Catholic students entering Grade 3 and above)
 - Immunization Records (yellow card or print out from physician)
 - The most current Report Card (**required for students applying for 1st - 8th grade**)
3. After submission of the online application, an appointment will be scheduled for the Pre-Kindergarten Interview or Grade K – 8th Entrance Testing.

If your child is accepted for enrollment, an acceptance letter will be mailed to you as soon as possible (within 1-2 weeks) after the interview/testing. The following form will be included with the acceptance letter and will need to be submitted with the registration fee by the date listed on the form.

- Preliminary Registration Form

The following forms (if applicable) will be included with the acceptance letter and will need to be completed by the date(s) listed on the Admission/Registration Requirements sheet.

- Physician's Report - Child Care Centers, Pre-Admission Health Evaluation (Pre-Kindergarten applicants)
- Report of Health Examination and TB Risk Assessment for School Entry (Kindergarten applicants)
- Report of Health Examination and TB Risk Assessment for School Entry (1st Grade applicants**)
- Authorization to Release School Records (For students applying for 1st - 8th grade)

***If this was done when child entered Kindergarten, previous school or parent must provide us with a copy otherwise this form will need to be completed again.*

ADMISSION CRITERIA

Acceptance is based on age requirement for the grade applied for and specific criteria of readiness and performance. Exceptions cannot be made on the age requirement.

Priority is given to:

1. Families who currently have children enrolled at St. John's.
2. Registered, supportive parishioners at St. John's or St. Elizabeth's in Milpitas.
3. Children of other Catholic Parishes.
4. Non-Catholic Students.

* Please note that Non-Catholic students who are accepted for admission must attend religion class and other religious activities of the school.

*These priorities are guidelines only. The pastor and principal shall have broad discretionary authority in the application of these guidelines to specific situations.

School Wide Learning Expectations

Upon the completion of eighth grade, a St. John the Baptist School student will be:

1. A **person of faith** who:
 - Demonstrates “Christ-like” values of compassion, service, and prayer.
 - Actively participates in school and parish liturgies.
 - Is responsible and makes good choices.
 - Demonstrates a knowledge of Catholic doctrine and traditions.

2. A **life-long learner** who is:
 - Able to demonstrate mastery of basic skills.
 - Self-motivated and cooperative.
 - An effective communicator.
 - A critical thinker.
 - Able to use all learning tools effectively and responsibly.

3. A **socially and emotionally well-rounded individual** who:
 - Is a responsible citizen.
 - Helps and respects all of God's people and all living things.
 - Demonstrates leadership and self-esteem.
 - Has an understanding of his/her gifts and areas for growth.
 - Demonstrates self-discipline.
 - Shows a cheerful and polite attitude.

4. A **physically well-balanced individual** who:
 - Shows both teamwork and self-reliance.
 - Plays honestly and fairly.
 - Cares for and respects his or her body and is aware of health issues.
 - Recognizes the importance of and chooses nutritious food.
 - Regularly engages in healthy physical activity.

This is a “student- friendly” adaptation of the formal student learning expectations of St. John the Baptist School, which are found in the school handbook and posted in each classroom.

Parent Commitment

We do have certain expectations of all parents. Since these expectations are binding on all parents, they are in effect a pre-requisite for acceptance and registration in the school. Expectations are:

- **Honor the Financial Agreement regarding tuition payments.**
- **Commit to St. John's Capital Fund Pledge. (This is tax deductible)**
- **Fulfill the Family Service Obligation** (perform service for the school).
Examples of family service jobs are: hot lunch/yard duty helper, fundraiser event helper, sports coach, etc. If unable to commit to an activity you have the option to payout by check or cash at registration or you may add the payout fee to your tuition payments.
- **Fulfill the Family Fundraising Obligation** (raise money). *Several fundraising opportunities may be available during the school year to help raise these funds. Such as, Scrip (gift cards), Walk-a-thon, etc. The Fundraising Obligation balance is due in April of each school year. There is also the option to payout by check or cash at registration or you may add the payout fee to your tuition payments.*
- **Attend Parent-Teacher Conference** (a 15-minute appointment with your child's teacher, held in October (weekdays) between the hours of 12:45-4:00 PM).
- **Attend Mandatory Parent Meetings such as; Back to School Night, PTG General Meeting, etc.**
- **Read the School Handbook upon receipt (August) and be knowledgeable of school policies.**
- **Read the School Bulletin on a regular basis (emailed twice a month on Friday).**
- **Complete the Online Mandatory Safe Environment Training (required by the Diocese of SJ). Website information will be given to you if your child is accepted for enrollment.**
- **Complete the Mandatory Fingerprinting – Cost: \$67 (required by the Diocese of SJ). Fingerprinting must be done by a specific company, company information and request for live scan form will be given to you during your registration appointment, normally in May.**

SCHOOL SCHEDULE (KINDERGARTEN – 8th GRADE)

The first bell for school rings at 8:05 AM. All K – 8th grade students, line up in their respective grades for the morning prayers and flag salute. Recess is from 10:00-10:15 AM. The students have time for a snack and play. Lunch is from 12:00 PM until 12:30 PM for grades 5-8 and 12:15 PM until 12:55 PM for grades K-4. Dismissal is at 3:05 PM. Every Wednesday there is a 12:45 PM dismissal for all grade K thru 8 students.

EXTENDED DAY PROGRAM (KINDERGARTEN – 8th GRADE)

St. John's has an Extended Day Program on-site for grades K thru 8. It opens at 6:30 AM and closes at 6:00 PM. It is available every day when school is in session, except the last day of school in June. During holidays and vacation the Extended Care program is closed. Payments are due every two week.

UNIFORMS

All students (Pre-K – 8th grade) wear uniforms on a daily basis. Our uniforms are purchased through Dennis Uniforms. The store location, cost sheet, and dates of the on-campus sales event will be included with the New Parent Information Packet.

LUNCH

St. John's does not have cafeteria facilities; therefore, we ask that parents provide all snacks and lunches for their student. Hot Lunch is available Monday-Friday by Choicelunch for a separate fee, lunches must be pre-ordered and paid for online.

TRANSPORTATION

St. John's does not have a bus or transportation program. Each parent is responsible for driving their student to and from school and sports activities. Parents may form carpools to facilitate transportation.

Pre-Kindergarten

The Pre-K program is a five days a week program. Admission of eligible students is on a first come, first served basis. Due to California State licensing, each family is required to make an annual commitment to ensure certified caregivers are available. ****See Tuition Sheet for Pre-K Tuition Rates. ****

PRE-K ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (2018-19 School Year)

Applicants must be 4 years old by September 1, 2018. They must also speak and understand English and be potty trained, no exceptions can or will be made.

PROGRAM CHOICES

Program A: 8:05 AM to 12:05 PM, curriculum only

Program B: 8:05 AM - 3:05 PM, curriculum followed by 3 hours of extended care**

Program C: 8:05 AM - 6:00 PM, curriculum followed by 6 hours of extended care**

**Extended Care: consists of group playtime, arts & crafts, snack & rest time, and organized games.

PROGRAM CURRICULUM

- Our Pre-K program is activity based with an emphasis on learning at a developmentally appropriate pace. We direct the social, physical, psychological, and emotional development of each student to prepare them for Kindergarten. The daily schedule includes religion, sharing, outdoor play, snack time, story time, music and movement, motor skills, and planned learning activities.
- Coloring, cutting, pasting, etc. help the students develop their fine motor skills while being introduced to letter names and sounds of the alphabet. Nursery rhymes and rhyming are used daily to build language skills. Various activities, games and puzzles are planned around numbers, shapes, and counting.
- Reading followed by class discussion helps the students understand the daily story and build their vocabulary. Public speaking and responsibility are encouraged through sharing, leading the class in songs and rhymes, being a classroom helper and performing at parish and school assemblies.
- Gross motor skills are developed daily. Students are given opportunities to run, jump, hop, skip, balance, and play with balls along with a weekly guided physical education program.
- Jesus is always in the classroom as a part of our everyday activities. Students are reminded that Jesus is in everyone's heart. They are taught to make the Sign of the Cross, pray the Hail Mary, Our Father, and the Glory Be, and participate in school Masses. We teach our students that they are children of God.

SNACKS/LUNCH

Parents provide snack for their own student. Parents may either provide their student with lunch or pre-order lunch through Choicelunch. Program A students do not eat lunch at school but may still order from Choicelunch.

UNIFORMS

Children wear the regular uniform of the school; school P.E. uniforms are required on P.E. day.

Kindergarten

Lovingly known as "GOD'S PROJECT" where the seeds of learning are planted and nurtured in the garden of New Beginnings and Infinite Possibilities! Where, through a values-based curriculum, and a caring partnership between home and school, each "Special Child" grows in the knowledge of: Religion, Language Arts, and Mathematics, Science, Social Studies and Fine Arts. Kindergartners connect and apply what they learn. They develop competencies and creative skills in problem solving, communication, and management of time and resources that contribute to lifelong learning.

KINDERGARTEN ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (2018-19 School Year)

Applicants must be 5 years old by September 1, 2018. No exceptions can or will be made.

RELIGION

Students learn to identify God as a Creator who loves all people. Students reflect on their role in caring for God's creation. Kindergartners at St. John's School discuss and share how they thank God for all that they have been given. The students also recognize that prayer is talking with God. They learn about how the Holy Family is an example for all families, and that Mary is the Mother of God. Experiences in Mass and prayer services help the students to demonstrate reverence in Church. Kindergartners listen to and retell Bible stories. They learn some important words and actions of Jesus and focus on how a Kindergartener can follow Jesus' commandment to "love one another." Students in Kindergarten learn to recognize the needs of the poor, reflect on and demonstrate the importance of giving and sharing, and gain a deeper appreciation of different cultures.

LANGUAGE ARTS

Students learn about letters, words, and sounds and apply this knowledge to begin reading sentences. They build comprehension skills by identifying the basic facts of stories. They begin writing short sentences and begin speaking in coherent sentences. They can retell familiar stories and predict what will happen in stories.

MATHEMATICS

Students count, compare and classify objects by attribute; identify and extend patterns by shape, size or color; explore the concept of time using tools such as a calendar or clock; compare length, weight and capacity of objects; and describe geometric shapes such as circle, triangle, square, rectangle, cube, sphere and cone.

SCIENCE

Students identify major structures of common plants and animals (for example, stems, leaves, arms, wings) as well as characteristics of mountains, rivers, oceans and deserts. They perform all kinds of investigations, such as sorting objects by one or more physical attribute. They learn to apply the scientific method to all forms of learning.

SOCIAL STUDIES

Students are introduced to relationships, including how one event is connected to another and how geography affects events. They learn about historical figures, individual responsibility and the rules that govern society, the backgrounds of American citizens and the basics of local and national governments.

FINE ARTS

Students create, perform and participate in visual arts. They apply artistic processes and skills, using a variety of media. Beginning skills in the use of tools and processes are demonstrated, such as the use of scissors, glue, and paper. They draw and paint pictures to express feelings and explore ideas, both real and imaginary. In music, students sing age-appropriate songs from memory. Through the playing of simple instruments and dance movements, they demonstrate awareness of beat, tempo and melody.
